CHARLTON HORETHORNE THE VILLAGE HALL

At a committee meeting held in the Village Hall, Mr. W. Hole presiding, it was stated that the Hall is in need of funds. The committee is arranging for a skittling competition in the Barn, lent by Mr. Hole, and a house-to-house collection is also being arranged. The Treasurer (Mr. C. Shean) and the committee is hopeful that this appeal will be supported generously.

PARISH COUNCIL

The Chairman reported a number of complaints regarding the misbehaviour of the younger generation in the village and it was agreed that the matter be reported to the Board of School Managers, suggesting that stricter supervision over the children be kept during school hours and that the police be asked for supervision during out of school hours.

Mr. Broadway proposed that the Postmaster at Sherborne be approached regarding the late delivery of mail in the village. He said that whereas some people received delivery about 7.15 a.m. the majority of the villagers had to wait until much later which very often caused inconvenience. He also proposed, and the Council agreed, that post boxes be installed in Cowpath-lane and at the north end of the village.

It was decided to organise a house-to-house collection in aid of the Lynmouth Distress Fund and to ask the local branch of the Women's Institute if they would undertake it.
